These questions will guide our study of classic essays by Montaigne, Emerson, Twain, Churchill, C.S. Lewis, Mary Oliver, and others. We'll do writing exercises in addition to each week's reading. And we'll each write an essay by the end of the tutorial. Expect to spend at least 5 or 6 hours per week preparing for class and writing outside of our meeting time.
